From the Town Clerk's Office

2018 DOG LICENSES

It is time to license your dog (s). The deadline is April 1st but is extended to April 3rd since April 1st is a Sunday and our office is closed on Mondays. The cost is \$9.00 for a neutered dog and \$13.00 for an un-neutered dog. After April 3rd the cost will be \$11.00 for a neutered dog and \$17.00 for an un-neutered dog.

It is the law of the State of Vermont to license dogs annually. Owners of unlicensed dogs can be fined up to \$500 and/or the dog(s) could be impounded and destroyed.

It is the law of the State of Vermont that all dogs are vaccinated every three years. The first vaccination is only good for one year.

TAXES

The next property tax installment is due on May 11, 2018. The office will be open until 5 p.m. on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. The Town accepts postmarked envelopes.

SUMMER HOURS

Summer hours will begin the May 4th. The Town Office will close at noon on Fridays (except for the day property taxes are due). Summer hours will end the last Friday of September.


2018 TOWN MEETING

Town Meeting was on March 6 at the Roxbury Town Hall (Village School). Fifty-two voters attended the annual meeting. One hundred and forty-eight voters voted for Town Officials and the Montpelier Roxbury School District articles. All articles voted on the floor passed and all articles for the Montpelier Roxbury School District passed in both towns.

CENTRAL VERMONT INTERNET

At Town Meeting, the voters approved the Town of Roxbury to join into a communications union district to be known as Central Vermont Internet, under the provisions of 30 V.S.A. Ch 82.

2018-2019 PROPERTY TAX DUE DATES At Town Meeting, the voters approved the dates the property taxes will be due. The dates are the second Friday of August 2018 (10th), the second Friday of November 2018

(9th), the second Friday of February 2019 (8th) and the second Friday of May 2019 (10th).

NEW VITAL RECORDS LAW

There are new laws on Vital Records that will start on July 1, 2018 that is intended to bring Vermont in line with national best practices to enhance the safety and security of vital records, provide greater protection against identity theft, and reduce the potential for misuse of these legal documents. It should streamline the process for greater efficiency and reduce administrative burden. An applicant for certified copies of birth and death certificates must have a family or legal connection to the person named on the certificate. Applications will need to be fully completed and a valid form of identification presented to the Town Clerk before a certified birth or death certificate is issued. The applications will be entered into the statewide vital records system. Town Clerks will be trained on the new system before July 1st.

2018 STATE ELECTIONS

The Primary Election is on Tuesday, August 14, 2018. The General Election is on Tuesday, November 6, 2018. The Polls will open at 7 a.m. and close at 7 p.m. for these to elections. Voting will be at the Roxbury Town Office.

CELL TOWN UPDATE

According to the Vermont Public Service Department, the company responsible for the cell towers in Roxbury is experiencing financial difficulties. The technical issues causing the outage in Roxbury are unrelated to those financial struggles but the repair of the Roxbury facility is affected by the company's inability to build and maintain the network. A company representative has informed the Public Service Department the company will soon go out of business. It is anticipated that the network will soon shutdown. The Public Service Department is exploring its options.

GREEN- UP DAY

Green-Up Day is May 5th. Roxbury should be having the annual gathering. Please consider participating in Green-Up Day and keep Roxbury as clean as we can. Bring the trash that you picked up off the ground to the Town Garage. Green-Up bags will be available at the Town Office or contact Claire Chomentowski. There will be a tire collection at the Town Garage. Cost for tires will be \$2.50 each. If you have any questions, you can call the Town Office at 485-7860.

Earthwise Transfer Station in Waitsfield is also collecting tires on Green-Up Day.

There will also be a household hazardous waste collection for oil and latex base paints, primary batteries (AAA, D, 9V, etc) at no charge May 12th at Earthwise Transfer Station in Waitfield. Compact fluorescent bulbs at no charge, and up to ten 8 foot fluorescent lamp bulbs at no charge. Pesticides will be collected at no charge. More info will be out in April.

Roxbury Fire Dept. and Auxiliary

Spring Yard Cleanup? Remember Your Permit for Outdoor Burning!

The peak outdoor fire season in Vermont is mid- to late spring. Most of these wildland fires are the result of escaped fires from open burning by homeowners. In preparation for outdoor burning, it is important to contact your town fire warden or deputy warden for a Permit to Kindle Fire. This permit is required if there is no snow cover; some towns require the permit in all seasons. Roxbury's warden is Tim

Martin (485-6555) and deputy is Don Randall (485-8341 or cell 272-3330).

Other safety tips include:

- clear flammable material around the area
- stay at the fire site
- have a water source and rake/shovel close by
- burn only natural vegetative material -
- call 911 immediately if the fire gets out of control.

Dear RVS Families:

March 23, 2018

As the school year quickly comes to an end, the Montpelier/Roxbury merger looms on the horizon. With much speculation and anticipation for July 1st to arrive, I wanted to fully share the information that I presently have at my fingertips. There is still a great deal of work to be completed and important logistical decisions to be made, but I think this will answer a majority of your questions.

Montpelier/RVS Merger Updates!

- All budget items passed for the NEW 2018-2019 school year
- Since January, 2018 RVS teachers have been spending their Professional Development days with Montpelier to connect professionally and academically
- The merger is official on July 1, 2018
- RVS will become a PreK-4 school
 - PreK classroom teacher
 - o K classroom teacher
 - o 1-2 combined classroom teacher
 - o 3-4 combined classroom teacher

Questions?

- 1. <u>Is there school choice for students?</u>
- Residents of Roxbury in grades K-4 will attend RVS, the Board has no policy or provision regarding school choice between the elementary school buildings
- Current Roxbury residents in 7th grade are NOT grandfathered in so they will need to attend Main Street Middle

- School beginning fall 2018 for their 8th grade year
- Students currently in 8th grade are grandfathered in and can choose a high school, however they are encouraged to attend Montpelier High School.
- Students currently in grades 9-11 are also grandfathered in the school currently
 enrolled, however they too can switch to Montpelier High School.
- 2. What are the transition plans for FUTURE, grade 5-7 students?
- RVS is sharing family contact information with Main Street Middle School (MSMS)
- A visit to MSMS is scheduled in the Spring (more information to follow)
- 3. What about bussing?
- Bussing will be provided for the morning and afternoon runs at RVS
- Two busses will perform a route in the morning, arriving at RVS at approximately 7:20am
- The two busses will depart RVS at 7:25 AM, one going to the high school and one going to the middle school
- One bus will depart RVS in the <u>afternoon</u>
- One bus with grade 5-12 students will depart Montpelier and drop students at RVS where families will need to pick up their loved ones (The exact drop off time is TBD)
- 4. Will there still be an after-school program?
- The after-school program, known as Bridges, will continue
- Late bussing is still being discussed

- 5. Will there still be private after school, pre-school care from 11:00-5:00pm?
- Yes, this will continue in the PreK classroom

I hope this answers many of the questions you had. I will continue to share all of the information that comes my way. If something is unclear, please call (485-7768) or email me (<u>brownellb@wssu.org</u>) with any further questions.
